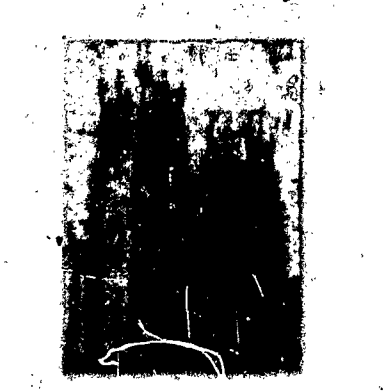

OWEGO — Two brothers, both former students at St. Patrick's Parochial School, have received well-merited promotion in their ranks in the U. S. Army. Lieut. Karl Rundell, who is serving with the Medical Corps in Australia, has been promoted to the rank of Captain and 2nd Lieut. Edmund Rundell, his younger brother, who is stationed at Fort Jackson, S. C. has received the rating of First Lieutenant. They are the sons of Mrs. F. Duane Rundell and the late Mr. Rundell and received their grammar school education at St. Patrick's and later attended the Owego Free Academy.

Capt. Rundell was graduated from Cornell Medical College in New York City while his brother attended Albany Law School. Dr. Rundell has been in Australia since the early part of 1942 having enlisted in January of that year with a unit of the Lakeside Hospital in Cleveland, O., where he had completed his internship. 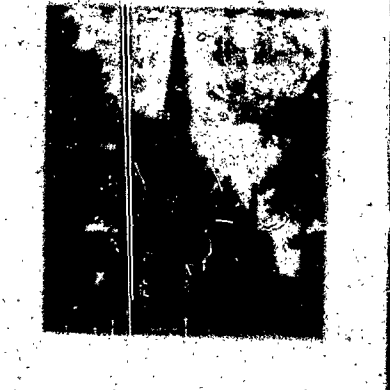
