OPA Gives Advice On Food Points

Blue stamps C, H, and J, totaling six points, in War Ration Book Two will become valid for the purchase of processed foods Saturday, and will be good throughout the month of May. Office of Price Administration announced today.

Blue stamps D, E, and F, which have been in use since March 25, expire on April 30. This means that blue stamps D, E, F, the April Series, and G, H, J, the May Series, all will be valid for the one week beginning April 26 to April 30. A similar "Overlap Period" was provided toward the end of last month, when the D, E, and F blue stamps for April were validated in March 25.

Purpose of the overlap period is to make it easier for housewives to shop toward the end of the month when their family books may lack a sufficient number of ration points to buy an item they need.

New stamps C, H, and J, it was pointed out, are on the page opposite the one which consumers are now using, with stamps lettered C forming the outside right-hand row of the ration-book page. This arrangement, it was explained, makes it easy to remove stamps in their alphabetical order. The letter "I" has been omitted from the series because of its possible confusion with the numeral "one."

In validating stamps on a new page in the ration book, OPA again cautioned housewives about the need for care in tearing out stamps.

"Be sure you are removing stamps from only a single page" is the advice of OPA, "since it is easy to mistakenly tear out stamps from two pages that stick together." Consumers are reminded that the retailer may not legally accept loose stamps. Stamps that are partially torn from ration books can be easily lost.

What Might Have Been

An editorial in the Catholic News, published in the interest of the Archdiocese of New York.

The Don Bosco Bulletin, a Catholic bi-monthly edited and printed by and for the inmates of Elmira Reformatory, where the Rev. Francis J. Lane is chaplain, presents some thought-provoking statistics. Perhaps the most significant of them is the fact that of the 267 inmates received in 1942 who claimed to be Catholics, only sixty-one, or about twenty-two per cent, ever attended a Catholic school. Only twenty-four, or five per cent, spent six or more years there and only eight, or less than four per cent, received all their education in that atmosphere. Yet about half the Catholic children of parochial school age in the nation are in Catholic schools.

Although only six or seven per cent of those committed during the year previously attended church regularly, ninety-eight per cent of those paroled in that period received the Sacraments while in prison. Ten Catholic inmates have died at Elmira in the past twenty-two years; all died with the Last Sacraments. Sixty per cent of the Catholic inmates are members of the Holy Name Society. If that is their reaction to the ministrations of a zealous chaplain, we may well assume that the lives of most of them would have been immensely different if they had had the blessing of education in a religious atmosphere.

304 In Armed Forces

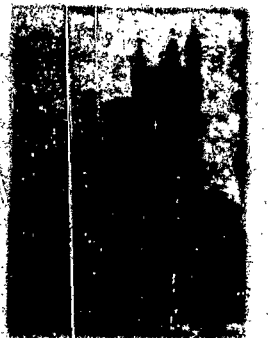
