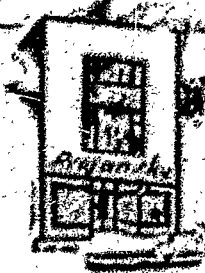

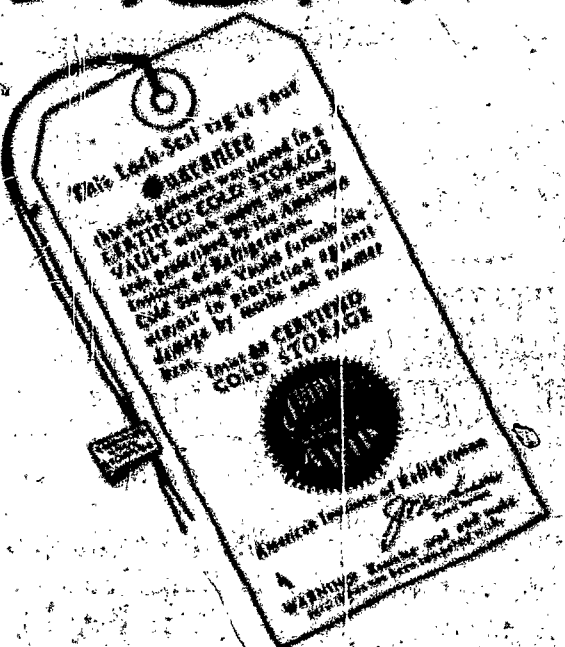

While at Immaculate Conception parish he took out a private pilot's license and was the first pilot of the Rochester Airways to become an aviator.

Transferred to Assistant Pastor at St. Patrick's Church, Clinton, on June 28, 1937, he continued his work with the youth until named Pastor of St. Mary's Church, Newville, and St. Joachim's, Conitama, on May 5, 1938.

As far as was known, Father Wise had been in good health. In March he underwent a femoral surgery to correct a slight arthritis condition. At the time of the operation he had a general physical examination which showed only a slight heart murmur, which the doctors at the time did not believe would ever become serious. During the past Lenten season he had preached at St. Ann's Church, in Hornell.

Born March 26, 1897, he made his preliminary studies at Ashburn High School and prepared for the Holy Priesthood at St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries.

Widely known in the diocese, he was highly esteemed for his sacerdotal zeal and genial disposition. Word of his death brought a distinct shock to the many who knew him.

VATICAN IS TERMED 'BEST LISTENING POST IN WORLD'

CHICAGO. — The Vatican was termed the "best listening post in the world" today by Dr. Lea F. Stock of the Historical Research Division of Carnegie Institute, Washington, D. C., addressing the Chicago Carroll Forum's final 1943 session here on "Diplomatic Relations with the Vatican." He said the "establishing of such relations would be advantageous to the United States, giving our country the benefits of the Church's age-old wisdom and diplomacy.

"Our gain," Dr. Stock said, "would be far greater than that received by the Vatican."
