Durand and the former Alice Cutting, whose mother was Maria Brennan, of Canny, Tipperary, Ireland. He has been in the mission field since 1912.

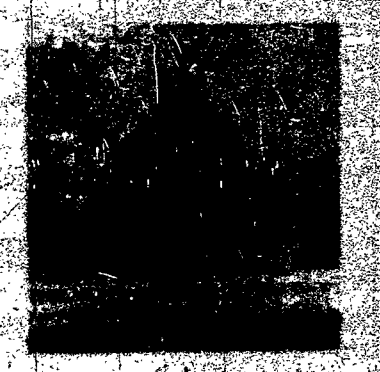

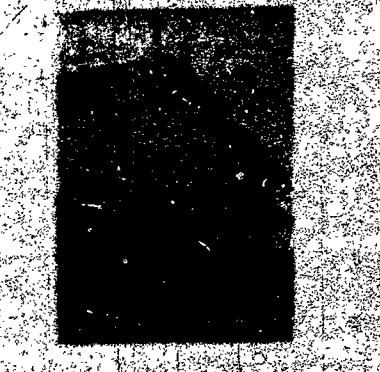
