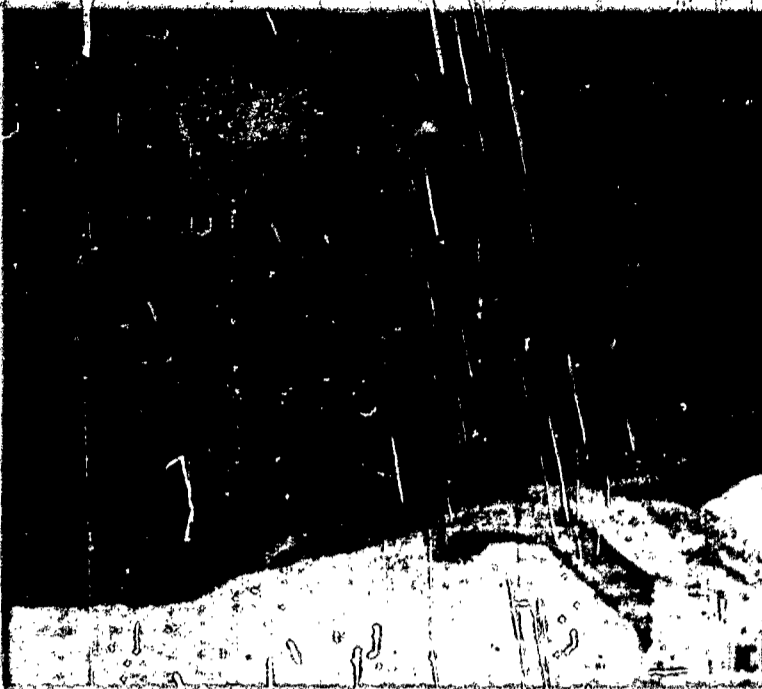

Daniel J. Sullivan, Arctic League Founder Dies At Age 56

Daniel J. Sullivan, 56, of 43 E. Washington Ave., St. Peter and Paul's parish, well known in Elmira as one of the founders of the Arctic League, died of a heart attack at his home on Sunday, Apr. 25, at 8 P. M.

Mr. Sullivan was a trustee of St. Peter and Paul's Church and a member of the Holy Name Society of that church. He belonged to the Elmira Reformatory Board of Visitors and was a Second Ward Democrat committeeman for several years.

The story of his discovery of a homeless boy, whom he took to Leongoro's cigar store on Lake St., where kindly Elmira business men befriended him, gave him food, clothing, medical attention, and a job, thus starting the permanent organization now known as the Arctic League...

Mr. Sullivan has been in the insurance business for about 25 years. He was born and received his early education in Elmira schools, and later attended the Mercersburg, Pa., Academy. He was employed by the City of New York when the new water system was constructed, and in the Elmira City Engineer's office.

K. of C. Scholarship Exams Set May 1 At Catholic High

Examinations for the Knights of Columbus scholarship will be held in Elmira at Catholic High School on Saturday, May 1, beginning at 9 a. m. Applications have been sent in by eligible students who are relatives of Knights of Columbus.

The five districts within New York State are based, as nearly as possible, on the number of Knights resident therein. In each district, a scholarship is awarded to be applied by the student towards his education in any college conducted under Catholic auspices in New York State. Provisions for girls is identical, except that the number of districts is three. Any boy or girl who is the son, daughter, brother or sister of a Knight of Columbus in any part of the state may, on graduating from high school, compete for the scholarship.
