Services in the evening will consist of the Rosary, a sermon and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament and will begin at 7:45.

The sermon on Sunday evening will be preached by the Rev. Chas. Cenac, assistant pastor of Old St. Mary's Church; on Monday evening by the Rev. Dr. Elmer A. McNamara, S.T.D., professor of Sacred Scripture at St. Bernard's Seminary; and on Tuesday evening by the Rev. Joseph Cipriano, Pastor of St. Francis of Assisi Church. Confessions will be heard each evening after the services.


