Forty Hour Devotions Sunday

The Forty Hour Devotion will begin in Corpus Christi parish on this Sunday, May 9, at the 11:00 solemn High Mass. After the Mass of Exposition the processions will bear the Blessed Sacrament in honor around the church to the Altar of Exposition.

Masses for the Forty Hour Devotion will be on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday at 8:30, 7:30 and 8:00 with the closing Mass of Exposition on Wednesday at 8:00. Services in the evening will consist of the Rosary, a sermon and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament and will begin at 7:45.

The sermon on Sunday evening will be preached by the Rev. Chas. Connell, assistant pastor of Old St. Mary's Church; on Monday evening by the Rev. Dr. Elmer A. McNamara, S.T.D., professor of Sacred Scripture at St. Bernard's Seminary, and on Tuesday evening by the Rev. Joseph Cirincione, Pastor of St. Francis of Assisi Church. Confessions will be heard each evening after the services.

A Plenary Indulgence during the Forty Hour Devotion is granted to all who (1) visit the Blessed Sacrament during Exposition; (2) pray six Our Fathers, six Hail Marys and six Glorias for the intention of the Holy Father; and (3) receive the Sacrament.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

The children of the parish will receive their First Holy Communion on Sunday, May 30, at the 8:00 o'clock Mass. Preparation of the children for this important step will begin this week. Chil-

dren attending public school will have their instructions on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays at 8:45 in the Corpus Christi Church. To make their First Holy Communion this year all children must be at least seven years of age before next September. Parents who have any children ready to receive their First Holy Communion this year, should register them at the rectory this week or on next Monday afternoon at 7:45 in the church.

SERVICE MOTHERS TO MEET

After the Forty Hour Services the Service Mothers Club will meet in the east chapel for their May meeting. The members of this club will receive Holy Communion in a body on Sunday, May 16, at the 8:30 Mass.

ADULT CONFIRMATION CLASS

A class for any adults who have not as yet received the Sacrament of Confirmation, will be held in Corpus Christi Rectory on this coming Monday evening after the Forty Hour Services. All adults, particularly those who have been recently received into the Church, are asked to register at the Rectory for these instructions.

Seek State Guard Recruits

NEW YORK. - Announcement has already been made in the press in connection with the annual field training of the New York State Guard at Camp Smith, Peekskill, N. Y., from June 13 to Sept. 29, 1943. The training periods will consist of ten days for each regiment in groups of two regiments for each period.

Field training augments the armory training which the regiments receive during the winter months, concentrating upon activities which the limited confines of the armories do not permit.

The officers and men have the opportunity to fire on the finest

rifle ranges on the eastern seaboard. They participate in field maneuvers, witness graphic demonstrations connected with the training doctrines, and live the life of soldiers from the day of arrival to the day of departure.

The personnel of the regiments is transported, clothed, equipped, housed and fed at the expense of the State. They are also paid the same amount as are received by the members of the Regular Army.

Field training offers an opportunity for a healthful, active, interesting and instructive ten days at one of the most beautiful campsites in the country.

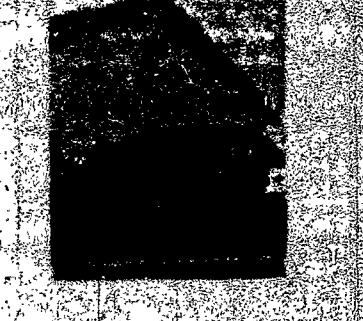

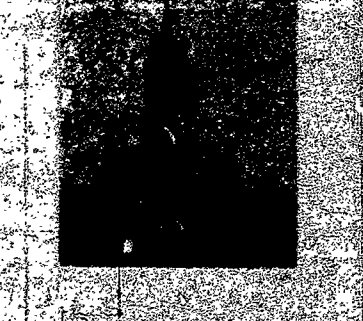
