OPA Rules On Point Rationing

Nearly 3,000 wholesalers and retailers in the Rochester OPA district were to file inventories of red stamp sales in meats and edible fats at their local rationing boards starting May 3.

Records of red stamp sales were kept over a one-week period ending May 1 to provide data on trade activity of foods sold under the meats and fats rationing program for further point revision in Washington in June.

Investigations were taken as of close of business Saturday, May 2. Retailers and wholesalers have until May 14 to complete registration at ration boards. OPA officials stated.

Quick check here on May 3 indicated that only 441 out of more than 2,000 hotels, restaurants and drinking establishments in Monroe County had filed menu prices with the War Price and Rationing Board in No. 12 School.

Deadline for filing prices charged to customers during the week between April 4 and 10 and was last Saturday, May 1. Purpose of filing these prices is to give Washington a check on conditions and to back up its recent "hold the line" policy on cost of living. No action will be taken unless it is found that these establishments are charging exorbitant prices.

Office of Price Administration advised rationing boards to send out a form letter this week to all establishments that have not filed prices requesting them to comply with the regulation.

Slate Tax Expert To Discuss Ruml Plan
