Pamphlet On Pope Pius XII Efforts For Peace Published

WASHINGTON, May 6.—Titled "Pius XII and Peace: 1892-1942," a pamphlet just has been published by the Publication Office of the National Catholic Welfare Conference here, embodying excerpts from the message of His Holiness on the subject of international peace, beginning with his first radio message to the world on Mar. 2, 1939, and continuing through his message of last Christmas.

The purpose of the publication, the office announced, is to show the continuity of the Holy Father's efforts "to get an acceptance by the nations of those principles, without which there can be no hope of peace though the war be won."
