**DETROIT.**—(NCCS)—On Royal Canadian Air Force stationery postmarked Chatham, New Brunswick, a cadet, A. They registered at the USO, approximately at midnight on February 11, and were sent with me to the Knights of Columbus Hall to sleep. I would appreciate it very much if you would find out their full names and addresses and forward same to me. Their first names were Archie and Paul. Thanks very much. They know me only as 'Canuck'." Back in their February dormitory records NCCS office helpers searched for an Archie and Paul registered on the specified night. Thanks to their duplicate filing system, a letter was sent on its way to Coleman, with the full names, location, and mailing address of his fellow fliers.

#### Extend Services To Men At Out-Posts

**GAYVESTON, Tex.**—The Menard Park NCCS unit, operated by the National Catholic Community Service, has announced the extension of its services to include soldiers assigned to out-post duty in the vicinity. In cooperation with other local USO agencies, Menard Park Club provides a movie film weekly for men who cannot come to the club, as well as stationery, books, games, magazines, playing cards and other recreational materials.

Smaller entertainment aids are furnished in hospitals and service clubs at Fort Crockett and Camp Wallace for the benefit of men who are convalescent or restricted to the post. Religious supplies and literature are also provided upon request.

### INDULGENCED ASPIRATION ANNOUNCED AT VATICAN

**VATICAN CITY.** The Sacred Penitentiary has issued a decree by which His Holiness Pope Pius XII grants a partial indulgence of 100 days and a plenary indulgence which may be gained monthly under the usual conditions, for the recitation of the following aspiration:

"Most Holy Trinity we adore Thee and through Mary offer Thee our petition. Grant to all unity in the Faith and courage to profess it unswervingly."

This has served to recall here the aspiration in behalf of Russia to which Pope Pius XI attached a 30-day indulgence, namely: "Saviour of the World save Russia."

### VICTORY 'ARMY OF PRAYER' GAINS WIDE APPROVAL

**PASO ROBLES, Calif.** Twenty-six members of the Hierarchy have given approval to his plan for the Blessed Virgin's "Army of Prayer" which he inaugurated in his parish a little more than a month ago, the Rt. Rev. Mgr. Michael Sullivan, pastor of St. Rose's Church here, announced today.
