Father Stauder as General Chairman of the affair has announced a special meeting of all those willing to assist. These will

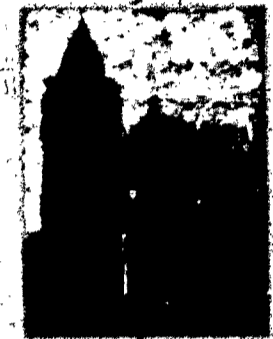
meet on Friday evening, May 22, at 8 o'clock in the school. Final preparations will be made at that time.
