## Mass for Servicemen

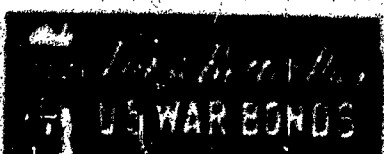

## Successful Fete

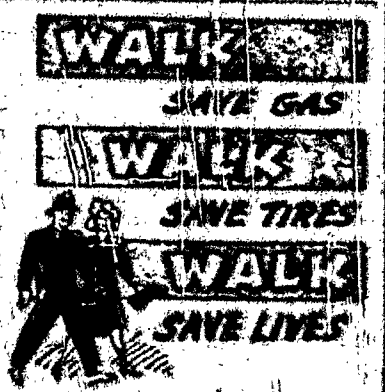
