He served in the British Isles before taking part in the initial landings in North Africa Nov. 8. He had won a number of medals, including one for marksmanship.

A graduate of Corpus Christi School, he had attended East High School before entering the grocery business. He sang in the Corpus Christi Church choir as well as the R. of C. choir.
