#### LEAVE ON RETREAT

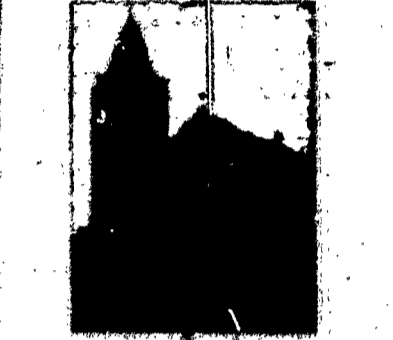
