In his writings and in his lectures Monsignor Sheen forces communism to condemn itself for his knowledge of the subject is based upon first hand information of official communists.

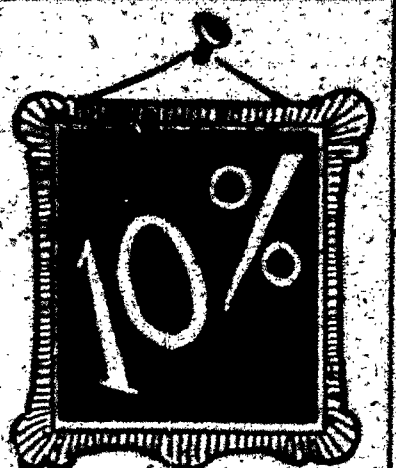
