CATHOLIC CHURCH

His Excellency, the Most Rev. James P. Kearney, state chaplain to the Most Rev. Msgr. John F. O'Hara, CSC, Military Chaplain of the Armed Forces in a Mass at the state convention held here. Presentation was made at a banquet in Hotel Tex Eck at which the Most Rev. J. Francis A. McIntyre of New York, Supreme Knight Francis P. Matthews, Supreme Secretary Joseph F. Lamey and Supreme Director Michael F. Walsh were among the guests of honor.

In accepting the gift on behalf of the Chaplains Aid Association, Bishop O'Hara commended the Knights for their continued interest in the work of the priests serving with the armed forces. He cited the record of the Army Chaplains Commissioned by the men in service and said they too were helping the chaplains when they had been compelled to take charge of the units.

Knights' Auxiliary, presenting the gift, stated that the Catholic Chaplains Aid Association was formed by the men in the service who were asked after the attack on Pearl Harbor to take charge of the chaplains paraded into the States. The goal of Archibald, however, in providing for the Chaplains' welfare was as military "One and in preserving many precious relics to tell the men we care by Bishop Keane.

N. Council Presidents

The convention was opened on Friday morning with Solemn Eccllesiastical Mass celebrated by His Excellency, Bishop Kearney at Rochester in the presence of the Most Rev. Edmund J. Gleeson, Bishop of Albany, who had on Wednesday observed his Golden Jubilee in the Holy Priesthood.

Dr. "Khalil of the City and Country," the Rev. Dr. Maynard Conwell of St. Bernard's Seminary lectured on "Catholic and Anti-Catholic women at the working Eccllesiastical Mass. He urged the Knights to wish the Christian Word of Right Living and Social Morality as a formidable weapon against tyrants in a world racked by war. That the "Gold Cup with the Red Hand of God" he ever held up was the hand of judgment, he said, and fifth in it is the only reason for hope.

At the convention His Excellency, Bishop Kearney, following his report as State Chaplain was presented with a set of birettes in behalf of the State Council by Lt. Col. Hugh A. Doyle, U. S. Coast Guard, of New Rochelle, retiring as State Deputy after three years of successful Catholic achievement. He was presented a gift by Supreme Director Walsh in behalf of the 260 councils representing in the state organization.

Elected as second Lt. Col. Doyle as head of the 10,000 Knights of Columbus in New York State was Stephen J. Cushing Jr. of Brooklyn, who served the past three years as State Treasurer.

Chosen with State Deputy Cashier were William E. Burke, Ulster, State Secretary, Hugh A. Fox, New York State Treasurer; George A. Timone, New York State Advocate; Edward T. Burke, Danville, State Warden.


