## Holds Original Deed To Site of Xavier's First Chapel in Japan

VATICAN CITY. — The Society for the Propagation of the Faith at Lyon, France, recently came into possession of a precious document: a two-page scroll on which is recorded in ancient Chinese characters the deed made in 1587 ceding to St. Francis Xavier the land on which he built his first chapel in Japan. The document was discovered by Father Villon at the Foreign Missions of Paris who spent almost 60 years in Japan.

Before his death there a few years ago, Father Villon acquired the site of the original chapel, which is at Daido, Yamaguchi, and erected a statue of St. Francis Xavier. A bust of Father Villon, who did much research about the early life of the Church in this section and compiled his findings in an important volume, has been placed beside the statue.

The deed, which arrived safely in France some months ago, was accompanied by two copies, one of which has been given to ecclesiastical descendants of St. Francis and the other to the family of Father Villon.

aid of funds provided by the late Very Rev. Godfrey Schilling, C.P.M., founder and builder of the Commissariat of the Holy Land, Washington, D.C.
