LIMA, (C. O.)—A crusade in defense of Catholic truth, initiated by a group of Catholic women here and having the approbation and blessing of His Excellency the Most Rev. Fernando Cento, Papal Nuncio to Peru, and the Most Rev. Pedro Pascual Barfen, Archbishop of Lima, is following the Evidence Guild Method... The crusade has already opened three fronts of religious instruction. One group meets at the old millie grounds, Parque de la Reserva, on Sunday afternoons; another in the Victoria section on Wednesday at 8 P. M. and the third in the new Azcona residential section on Sundays, Tuesdays and Thursdays at 8 P. M. The last is a quarter in which Protestant propaganda has been very intense.

Auburnians Await Lecture By Monsignor Sheen

AUBURN—Rt. Rev. Msgr. Fulton J. Sheen will deliver his address "The Perils of Our Times" at East High School this evening at 8:15. Mr. Eugene C. Donovan, president of the Auburn Trust Company, president of the Board of Education, past president of the New York State Bankers' Association and civic leader, will introduce the Monsignor. Music by a stringed trio will be heard for forty-five minutes previous to the commencement of the lecture.

Msgr. Fulton J. Sheen, son of Newton Morris Sheen and Della Fulton Sheen, was born in the little town of El Paso, Illinois, on May 8, 1903. He graduated from Spaulding Institute in 1913 and received his A. E. degree from St. Victor's College, Kanankake, Illinois, in 1917 and his A. M. degree from St. Victor's in 1919. He attended St. Paul's Seminary in Minnesota and was ordained to the Holy Priesthood on Sept. 29, 1919. He received the degree of S. T. B. and J. C. B. from the Catholic University of America at Washington in 1920. Louisville University

in Belgium conferred the Ph. D. degree in 1923 and the degree in philosophy in 1923. He received the degree of D.D. in Rome in 1924.

Honorary Awards
The Monsignor might add several honorary degrees to his name, if he so desired. He received the degree of LL.D. in 1927 from St. Victor College and from Loyola University in Chicago during the same year. Marquette University honored him with the degree of Litt.D. in 1928. He received the LL.D. degree in 1929 from St. Bonaventure College and in 1941 from Notre Dame University. St. John's University in Brooklyn conferred the degree of Doctor of Humane Letters in 1941. Monsignor Sheen received the Cardinal Mercier prize in philosophy from Louvain in 1925 and the Cardinal Maxella Medal in philosophy from Georgetown University in 1924. The Holy Father named him a Papal Chamberlain in 1924 with the title of Very Rev. Monsignor and in 1933 he was named a domestic prelate with the title of Right Rev. Monsignor.

The Monsignor has lectured at St. Edmunds College in Ware, England; at Westminster Cathedral in London in 1925 and from 1928 through 1931, at the Catholic Summer School of America at Cliff Haven, at the University of

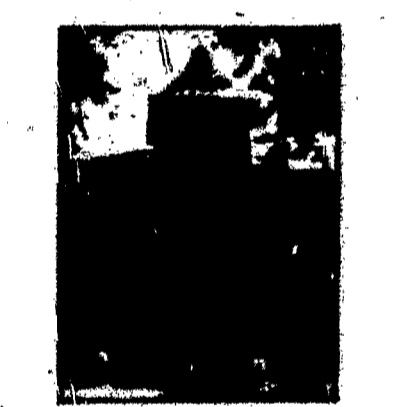
