

ST. BONIFACE PARISH

MARK PATRONAL FEAST

Last Sunday marked the 12nd celebration of the Feast of St. Boniface, our patron saint, who was born in England about 480. After joining the Benedictine Order he went to Holland and then to Germany, where he spent the rest of his life in Apostolic labor. He was made Archbishop of Mainz and eventually was martyred by the barbarians, June 5, 754. The Knights of St. John and Ladies Drill Team participated in the celebration. The newly ordained priest, the Rev. Albert Schnackey, celebrated his first Solemn Mass on the Feast of St. Boniface and the speaker was Rev. George J. Schmitt. Several hundred people went to the parish hall during the afternoon to meet the new priest and receive his blessing.

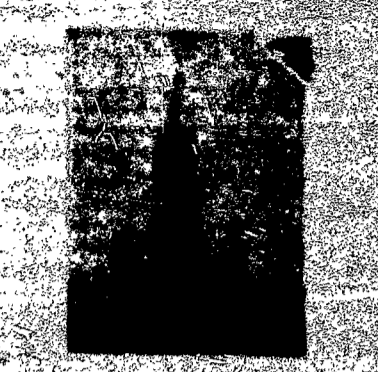

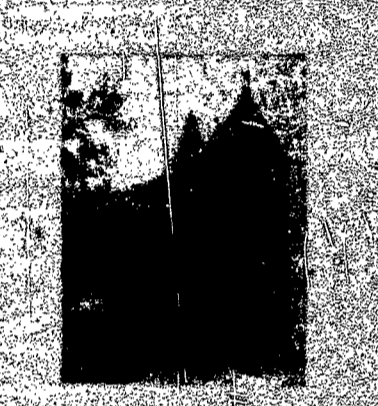
