Daniel Reagan Dies, Prominent Merchant, Esteemed Layman

Dennis J. Reagan, 115 Democrat Parkway, Our Lady of Lourdes Parish, leading Elmira merchant, died of a heart attack at his home at 5:30 A. M. on Saturday, June 5, 1942. The 72-year-old merchant had not been ill, and his death was a shock. He had worked at his store on Water Street until 8 P. M. the night before.

Proprietor of the Walsh and Reagan furniture store which he had founded with his late brother Walsh in 1914, for nearly thirty years, Mr. Reagan had worked in several furniture stores in Elmira until that time.

He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Reagan. In 1915 he married the former Ellen Yenger of Elmira, who survives.

Prominent in business and fraternal life, Mr. Reagan was a member of the Association of Commerce, the Elmira Knights of Columbus, the Elks and Eagles Fraternities, and the Cold Brook Club.

Besides his wife he is survived by his daughters, Helen Elizabeth of Elmira, and Mrs. John W. O'Leary, Trenton, N. J.; a sister, Mrs. Richard T. Verian, Elmira.

A solemn High Mass of Requiem was celebrated by the Rev. Leo G. Schwab at 8 o'clock on Tuesday, June 2, at Our Lady of Lourdes Church, the first solemn Requiem to be offered there. Father Schwab was assisted by the Rev. J. J. Moriarty and Rev. Clarence Gardner. Rev. Thomas J. Toole was in the sanctuary.
