Editorial in Yonkers Paper Hits Birth Curb

YONKERS.—(AP)—An editorial in the Herald Statesman, socialist newspaper of this city, denouncing the "No Children Allowed" rule of apartments and small houses for lease, concluded with a denunciation on birth control.

The editorial pointed out that the widow and tiny son, "Dinky" of Capt. Colin Kelly, World War II air hero, were barred from apartments and small houses in Los Angeles by the "No Children Allowed" rule when they moved there after obtaining employment. The Kellys at length found quarters when a relief worker, transferred to another city, allowed them to take her small house.

The editorial states that "a people which deliberately, out of economic selfishness and physical softness, deprives its own birth rate can not long hope to remain a vigorous and dominant people." Attacking the "No Children Allowed" rule and birth control, the editorial said:

"All arguments to the contrary, notwithstanding, God didn't make any man and woman to marry and live all their days in a two-room apartment, lavishing their affection on a dog or a cat and spending their money on an eight-cylinder, bus-single-seat automobile. If God gives victory to America in this war, He will have the right to expect us to extend and sustain His moral civilization—and to that end we shall need a sturdy family strength."

Honor War Slain

Los Angeles.—The Most Rev. John J. Cantwell, Archbishop of Los Angeles, was among the religious leaders who took part in ceremonies to honor 300 Los Angeles men who have given their lives for their country since Pearl Harbor at exercises held in the Los Angeles Coliseum. Rabbi Edgar F. Maguin represented men of the Jewish faith and Protestant churches were represented by Dr. E. G. Farnham, executive secretary of the Los Angeles Church Federation.

Philadelphia.—The Silver Star Medal for heroism on Guadalcanal has been awarded to Lieut. J. J. Koonitz, a former altar boy at St. James' Church, Mt. Rainier, Md., whose family recently moved here. Lieutenant Koonitz volunteered on Jan. 20 to accompany a reconnaissance patrol, which put a Japanese machine gun crew out of action.
