Chaplain Koch Promoted To Colonel At Canal Zone

Chaplain Joseph R. Koch, a former Holy Redeemer Parish boy, now on duty in the Canal Zone, has won a promotion from lieutenant colonel to that of colonel, word has come from Headquarters, Panama Canal Department.

Born in Rochester in 1894, Colonel Koch attended Holy Redeemer School, St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminary. He continued his schooling at St. Thomas' Theological Seminary at Denver, and at the Catholic University, Washington, D. C. He was ordained on June 15, 1920, in Denver.

After eight years of priestly duty throughout Colorado, he entered the army. The press release from the Canal Zone states that he is considered most instrumental in the establishment of wartime social activities for the enlisted personnel of the Armed Forces where he is stationed. As Departmental Chaplain he has built up an enviable list of accomplishments since his arrival from Fort Benning, Ga., in August, 1943.

His first assignment on the Isthmus, while still a major, was at France Field, on the Atlantic Side. Here Colonel Koch performed the duties of post chaplain. Among his activities as such, he helped organize the Draftettes, the patriotic group of Atlantic Side women who, week after week, served as dancing partners for soldiers at various post functions.

Colonel Koch was responsible for the establishment of the first USO unit outside of the United States, which was organized at his post in August, 1941. He served in advisory capacity on many USO and UWSO committees, and is on the Advisory Council of the USO on both sides of the Isthmus.

The Colonel entered the Army on March 28, 1928, and was stationed at Fort Hill, Okla., during 1928 and 1929. From 1929 to 1931, he was stationed at Corregidor, in the Philippines. Then, from 1931 to 1934, he was assigned to the Army Medical Center (Walter Reed Hospital) in Washington, D. C. He assisted the Archbishop of Manila in conducting the first International Eucharistic Congress to be held in the Orient during his tour at Sternberg General Hospital, in the Philippines, from 1933 to 1937. He went to Fort Benning in 1937 and remained there until ordered overseas.
