NEW YORK.—(NC)—The cloistered Carmelite Sisters of Kunming, three victims of Japanese bombs, have now been raided by outlaw Yunnan bandits, suffering the loss of all their possessions, according to word received from the Rev. Mark Tennison, M.M., from the Maryknoll House in Chungking.

After the Kunming Carmel was twice damaged by Japanese bombing attacks, it was decided to remove the convent to a country village for safety. The village was in the center of bandit territory and during one bandit attack the Sisters had to flee to the mountains for safety.
