Perpetual Help Parish Memorial Services Held For First World War Dead

Solemn Memorial Services were held in the Church of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, on Sunday, May 20, for Corporal Raymond J. Herwind, the first member of the parish to give his life for his country in the present war. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Herwind, 1134 Joseph Ave., and the husband of Gretta Owen Herwind.

Corporal Herwind was killed when a bomb struck a hotel "somewhere" in England, where Corporal Herwind was spending a furlough, according to a telegram and letter received by the parents from the War Department. He was a graduate of Our Lady of Perpetual Help School, and had been serving in the Armed Forces for the past two years.

During the Memorial Services, Miss Marie C. Herwind, young sister of the late Corporal and member of the present graduating class of the school, placed a gold star on the Parish Home Hall in memory of her brother, while a bugle sounded taps. She was escorted to the Patriotic Shrine of Our Lady by a Color Guard, including August Meier, Miss Marcella Schorn, Edward Winterkorn and Kathleen Scharr. Ministers of the Mass were the Rev. Francis J. Hoefen, celebrant; the Rev. Milton J. Kelly, deacon, and the Rev. Joseph G. Merkel, subdeacon.

On Monday, Memorial Day, Father Hoefen sang a Solemn Mass of Requiem for the repose of Corporal Herwind's soul. Final Absolution was given at a sag-draped catafalque. The Mass was sung at the request of those who had formerly worked with Corporal Herwind at the Willnot-Qualls Co.

Corporal Herwind is survived by his parents and wife, besides two children, Phyllis and Eleanor, and the following brothers and sisters: Joseph, Bernard and Aloysius; Monica, Rosa, Marie and Teresa Herwind. All, with the exception of Bernard, who is stationed in Florida with the Army, are members of the Parish of Our Lady of Perpetual Help.

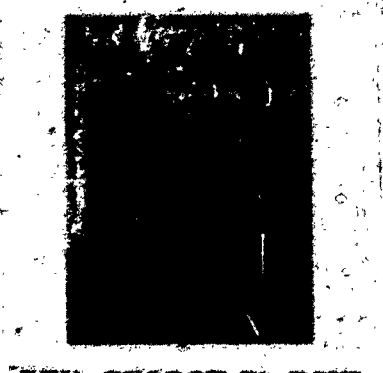
SILVER WEDDING
