WOMEN'S COMMUNION

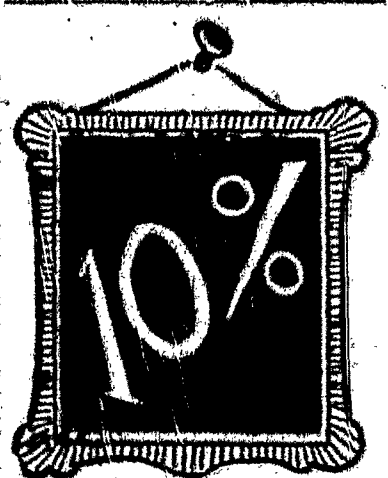
