## Conduct Funeral Rites For St. Joseph Nun

**Sister M. Amelia Hennessey**  
Funeral services for Sister M. Amelia of the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph were held in Holy Family Chapel at Nazareth Convent, Pittsford, on Thursday morning, June 15, 1943.

Solemn Mass of Requiem was celebrated by the Rt. Rev. Major George V. Burns, Rector of the Pro-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart, assisted by the Rev. Thomas F. McVain as Deacon and the Rev. John T. Callahan as Sub-Deacon. The Rev. Edward J. Lintz, chaplain of Nazareth College, was Master of Ceremonies.

Present in the Sanctuary were the Reverend Fathers Joseph H. Gaffell, Louis Edelman, John M. Duffy and Leo E. Davis. Interment was made in the Sisters' Plot in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery and the last blessing was given by Monsignor Burns, assisted by the Rev. Joseph Gaffell and the Rev. John T. Callahan.

Sister Amelia was born in Rochester and became a Sister of St. Joseph in 1918. She taught for many years in the Parochial Schools of the diocese and endeavored herself in the hearts of countless children in the old Cathedral and the Sacred Heart schools of this city. St. Mary's School, Waterloo, and St. Patrick's, Danville. Sister Amelia is survived by a number of sisters and nephews who reside in Rochester.
