If I Were The Pope...

You know him! He's the fellow who thinks the pastor preaches too long—or too little; the assistant doesn't get around the parish often enough—or he's never at the rectory when you call; the Sunday Masses begin too early, or run too late; confessions are heard at the wrong hours; there's too much talk of money; and the parish ought to do something about the debt; the officers from too much about the processions; the choir is no good; the vestments are shabby; and why, for heaven's sake, do they have so many evening devotions?

He could tell the bishop a thing or two about running the diocese, too. Even the Holy Father comes in for a regular drubbing. No one is spared. Nothing is sacred. If only he could see the Church for a day or two...

NOISES FOR ALL

It holds for persons and things, big and little; from the youngest assistant, just ordained, all the way up to the throne of St. Peter, and from the discipline of the sacraments all the way down to the kneelers in your parish pew.

Give the clergy credit for trying, anyway. They have their hands on the pulse of the parish, and they have dedicated their lives to your salvation. They are giving you their best possible service. Why, a man must spend twenty years in school, college, and seminary before the Church will grant that he knows enough just to hear your confessions!

There are bound to be differences in taste and judgment. One man would have an ornate rug in the sanctuary, another would lay down tile. That's only natural; just as some men wear Panama hats and others prefer salter straw.

It's best not to criticize, ever. We may mean well, but our remarks may be taken the wrong way; and very often what we've said gets back to the one criticized and hurts his feelings or causes misunderstanding. You have no idea of what it is to plan, work out, and rehearse a procession, for instance, and then to hear that there weren't enough flower girls, or that the altar boys looked clumsy.
