War Ration III Book Can Only Be Obtained Aug. 1

Applications for War Ration Book III cannot now be made to local War Price and Rationing Boards in the Office of Price Administration emphasized today. Not until Aug. 1 will local boards accept such applications from persons who failed to apply by mail before June 10, or from persons who did apply but for some reason, do not receive books.

Persons who receive War Ration Book No. 3 should not take the book to their Local Board to have information filled in on the cover. No board action is necessary, the OPA said. All the holder of a War Ration Book No. 3 is required to do upon receiving his book is to write in his address, age, sex, weight, height, occupation and signature in the space provided on the cover. No other information or action is necessary.
