Safeguarding Home Said Most Patriotic Duty

Delegates representing the state members of the Catholic Women's League of Chicago, in attendance at Hamilton, Ontario, were told that the most patriotic duty the home today is that of safeguarding the home.

Mrs. F. J. McGarry of Hamilton, Ont., the national president and the first national president, said, "Today is a world at war, when children are temporarily separated from their fathers, mothers must remain at their posts for children's needs have the highest priority rating."

"Ever and your patriotism and your enthusiasm for your work should not be a passing fancy, your mind must be on the fact that it is on the strength of your own and life that the other millions of our citizens live together."

Some indication of what patriotism means Chicago was given by a variety of patriotic activities on the home front, and the members of the Armed Forces were shown in reports of which school girls were:

Total war effort by children during the year was reported:

Manufactures for war service was \$4,377.

Assistance to the Red Cross Society included \$10,702 in cash, and 27,000 of 24,000 knitted articles and 7,115 sewn articles.

The sum of \$13,100 was spent in cigarettes and books for the front. (Cigarettes, 10,000; books, 6,115 books were sent to the troops).

There were distributed to camps, army huts and hospitals 127,000 books and magazines.

Religious articles supplied to chaplains included \$2,000.

Entertainment provided for 44,000 members of the armed forces and the merchant seaman.

Courses in first aid, home nursing and nutrition taken by 1,000 members.

Laywomen Retreat Group At St. Louis

ST. LOUIS—With the Most Rev. John J. Glennon, Archbishop of St. Louis, as host, the 20th national congress of the Laywomen's Retreat Movement will meet here July 2 to 5 to discuss the retreat movement and its relation to restoring the Christian home in the current emergency period.

Issuing a welcome, Archbishop Glennon said: "It is important in these tragic days when moral standards are threatened, when the sacred bond of matrimony is all too easily broken; when juvenile delinquency is alarmingly on the increase, for God, Mother and Daughters of the nation to come together with the high and holy purpose to see how best the home, the Church and the nation, under God's benediction, may be preserved."

Mrs. Charles Schmal, of Madison, Wis., is national president of the organization. Among those who will address the convention are the Rev. Peter Forbes, C.S.B., of Lebanon, Ind.; the Rev. Edward Lodge Curran, of Brooklyn, and the Very Rev. Martin Hoffmeyer, of St. Louis.

The Congress will be opened with a Solemn Pontifical Mass, at which Archbishop Glennon will officiate, in St. Louis Cathedral on July 2.

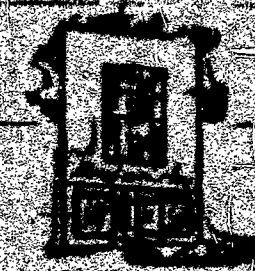
Hint For Housewives

If your cleaning company representative says: "Sorry—no gloves cleaned these days," it is because of shortages of cleaning fluids and workers, as well as restrictions on deliveries. You can wash your gloves at home. If you have (a) purchased washable leather gloves in the first place and (b) if you follow a few simple directions. Never wash a glove that has made even one trip to the cleaner, because the dry-cleaning solution removed all of the natural oil. Soap and water will then stiffen the leather. Wash gloves before they become too soiled. Wash the gloves vigorously and quickly in a rich suds of mild soap, warm, not hot. Rub any spots with a soft nail brush. Rinse the gloves in warm water, then in cold. Roll them in a towel and
