### Two Grammar Schools Graduate 74 in Geneva

GENEVA.—Marked by commencement addresses in which the value of Christian ideals was stressed, St. Stephen's and St. Francis de Sales parochial schools graduated seventy-four students at 8:30 on Friday evening (June 15) in religious services in both churches at 7:30 o'clock. Dignitaries were present to thirty-eight graduates at St. Francis de Sales and to thirty-six at St. Stephen's. The near similarity in the number of graduates was duplicated in the choice of commencement speakers, both being Navy chaplains from the United States Naval Training Station at Sampson, N. Y. Lt. E. E. LeCock, U.S.N.R., senior chaplain at Sampson, delivered the address at St. Stephen's Church, while Lt. John Maxwell was the commencement speaker at St. Francis de Sales. Rev. William H. McFadden, pastor of St. Stephen's Church, presented the members of the graduating class, and Rev. William J. O'Brien, presented the class from St. Francis de Sales.
