

ROCHESTER CHAPLAIN ASSISTS AT MASS FOR SLAIN IN NORTHAFRICA

(Chaplain Edward Fenton of the Rochester Diocese and another St. Bernardine Seminary graduate, Captain Henry Murphy of Hartford Diocese, are mentioned in the following NCHC News Service dispatch reporting a Mass for slain soldiers in North Africa.)

NEW YORKING—In "a magnificent cathedral in Northern Africa," Major General Terry Allen and 2,000 officers and enlisted men of the First Infantry Division attended a Solemn Requiem Mass for their comrades who fell in the African Campaign. It was learned yesterday from the Most Rev. John P. O'Hara, C.R.C., Military Delegate of the United States.

Bishop O'Hara received the information in a letter from Captain James E. McEvoy, a Brooklyn priest who is one of the division chaplains and who was assistant of the Mass.

Fr. Paul Kozlowski, O.M.C., was deacon of the Mass; Capt. Edward Waters, of the Diocese of Worcester, was sub-deacon, and Captain Francis O'Connor, was reader of ceremonies. Other priests present were Captain Lawrence Dwyer, of the Diocese of Providence, who preached "a moving and inspiring sermon"; Major Patrick B. Fay of the Archdiocese; Captain Henry Murphy of the Diocese of Hartford; Lt. Aloysius McGraw, of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia; Lt. Anthony DeLauria, of the Diocese of Brooklyn, and Lt. George R. Sherry, O.S.B.

The Mass was arranged by the Catholic chaplains of the division after the fighting. In his letter to Bishop O'Hara, Capt. McEvoy said, "We priests knew that you would be pleased to hear of this expression of our men's devotion and remembrance of their fallen friends."

"One of the seldom-mentioned and little-understood causes of the differences between General De Gaulle and General Giraud, and completely bewildering to the average American, is the undeclared fight between Vichy France and Free French Communists. Upon De Gaulle's demands, Giraud discharged several employees suspected of Fascism. When Giraud made a reciprocal demand, for De Gaulle to get rid of suspected Communists, the request was refused."

Here is another instance of how the Leftists and their radical friends are gambling for high stakes. By backing De Gaulle as the top man of French Forces, the Leftists plan to replace a Numbered France with a Seized France.

Admiral William H. Standley, U.S. Ambassador to Soviet Russia, is reported to be coming home soon. As a diplomat, the Admiral failed, but as a debunker of Soviet propaganda, the Admiral scored. Sometime ago, when the Soviets were calling loudly for a second front, the Admiral lost his patience. He publicly censured the Soviet officials for not telling the Indian people about the vast shipments of guns, planes, tanks and other material that America was shipping to Russia. Soviet officials never forgave our outspoken Admiral for exposing the fact that a very substantial part of the miracle of Russian resistance to Hitler was the American war material.

In a speech last Saturday in Boston, Admiral Standley told the Soviets "that the wartime cooperation now working to defeat Hitler will continue until Japan is defeated."

Russia, our ally, has a non-aggression pact with Japan, our enemy. Admiral Standley knows this and in his forth-right Yankee fashion he was really asking Mr. Johnson a question: "We have signed you. Will you help us?"

Italian War Prisoners Make Gift Of Altar To 'Humane' Polish Guards

The Mass celebration had been arranged by the Polish Guards, who were serving in the British army and were assisted by a British chaplain and interpreter. The Mass was conducted in Polish and was followed by the singing of the Polish national hymn.
