At the close of the Mass, Father Kelly gave a beautiful and impressive sermon on the Feast of Corpus Christi. Concerning his work and experience in the Navy, Father Kelly mentioned the faith and devotion of the recruits and their eagerness to receive the Word of God.

After returning to Camp Farragut, where he has been stationed, Father Kelly expects to be assigned to new duties.

Mass Honors First Knight Of St. John Killed In War

Solemn Memorial Mass for the repose of the soul of Private Robert L. Bossert, first Knight of St. John in Rochester to make the supreme sacrifice in World War 2, was offered in Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church, Sunday morning, June 27, at 8:30 a. m.

Words received during the week that Private Bossert, son of Mr. and Mrs. Alois J. Bossert of 47 Carthage St., had been killed in an accident in North Africa on June 4.

Celebrant of Mass was the Rev. Francis J. Hooley, pastor, assisted by the Rev. Milton J. Kelly as Deacon and the Rev. Joseph G. Merkol, Subdeacon.

In an impressive memorial ceremony, Mrs. Leonard Bossert, sister-in-law of the young soldier, placed a gold star on the Parish Honor Roll located at the shrine of Our Lady of Perpetual Help. She was flanked by the American flags of the Knights of St. John, Ladies Auxiliary Drill Team, Boy and Girl Scouts, each borne by members in the uniforms of their respective organizations.

The setting was further enhanced by the presence at the shrine of Commandery No. 40 and Auxiliary No. 45 Drill Team, Knights of St. John in full dress uniform standing at "present arms." Taps was sounded.

Private Bossert was graduated from Our Lady of Perpetual Help Grammar School in 1937 and from Aquinas Institute in 1941. Subsequently he was employed by Eastman Kodak Co. He was a member of Commandery No. 40, Knights of St. John of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish. He was also a member of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Dramatic Club.

His parents have been prominent in Knights of St. John circles for years. His father is a staff officer of Rochester Regiment and is secretary of the Second and Third Degree Team. His mother is president of Ladies Auxiliary No. 45, Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church. A brother Leonard is a uniformed member of Commandery No. 40.

Army Cadet Loses Life In Flying Crash

Aviation Cadet Anthony Ruffino, a graduate of St. Lucy's Grammar School, was killed in an airplane crash at Bruce Field, Hastings, N.Y., on June 21.

The 22-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Eugene Ruffino, 11 Hilltop St., had sent his parents a letter received the day before saying that he was going up for his first 40-minute flight. That afternoon a telegram from the War Department stated that he had lost his life on that flight.

His letter had stated: "Of course if I fall the 40-minute check flight Wednesday I'll still have two more chances. But I'm praying I'll make it 100 per cent, for that will mean I'll be going to basic training in a couple of weeks. That will be swell—a big kick and better ship to fly."

Cadet Ruffino was a former well-known Altar Boy at St. Lucy's Church.

After his graduation from St. Lucy's and Madison High School, the young man was an aeronautics student at Quoddy College, Quoddy, Me., before being inducted into the Army Air Force, Nov. 18, 1942. His preliminary training was received at San Antonio, Texas, and he was at Bruce Field a month.

A military funeral for Cadet Ruffino was held at St. Lucy's Church, Wednesday morning.

The Solemn Requiem Mass was offered by the Rev. Benedict Maselli, Pastor, assisted by the Rev. James O'Connell, Deacon, and the Rev. Sebastian Costegiacomo, C.F.P.S., pastor of Church of the Precious Blood, subdeacon.

First WAAC Group Overseas Includes Auburn Officer

AUBURN—Second Officer Jean A. Geherin, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. C. M. Geherin, 57 Franklin Street, is among the first officers to command a contingent of WAACs from the United States stationed permanently in England. She is among the first 12 Women's Army Auxiliary Corps officers who arrived recently at Allied Headquarters in London to supervise the first contingent of enrolled members of the WAACs who will assume jobs formerly held by soldiers. The WAACs stationed in England will continue to live the Army way which they learned at WAAC Training Centers in this country. They will be under the same rules and regulations that exist in the Corps in the United States.

Sorrowful Mother Novena

AUBURN—The Novena of Our Sorrowful Mother is held in St. Aloysius Church every Friday evening at 7:30. The Novena is now in its fourth year in the Auburn Church.

The number of requests received from army and navy chaplains, asking permission to install the Novena to Our Sorrowful Mother indicates that this devotion will be conducted in a majority of centers of the armed forces before 1943 ends. Father Terence M. Beery, O.S.M., national director of the world-wide Novena, stated during the past week in Chicago.

The Novena, now in its sixth year, is held every week in more than 1,200 churches. The devotion has just been introduced into seven more army camps, two navy stations, a convent, and 26 parishes. Two of the parishes are in Canada and one is in South America.

W.A.A.C. companies are now on duty at Allied Headquarters in England and North Africa and at nearly 200 Army posts, camps and stations in this country.
