Democracy's Need  
Revealed by Protest

BUREAU ATHENS.—(UPI)—The necessity will not be proved as long as leaders and those immediately behind them are not democracy people who have "well-organized bodies and well-organized souls," the Most Rev. Miguel de Andres, titular bishop of Tuzuman, said in an address at the ceremony which closed the Argentine Book Fair. The fair, sponsored by the Argentine Book Chamber and open to the public for a month, was visited by 1,000,000 persons.

Dismissing the various categories of scholarship, Bishop de Andres said: "The aristocracy of neither money, power nor blood has much effect on me, but there are others which I admire and respect: the aristocracy of labor, of virtue and of intelligence. Fortunately none of these have in the exclusive patrimony of a class and, according to the general rule, they arise from the people."

Unfortunately the aristocracy of intelligence has not become general because of lack of education. It lacks education; it has not been able to acquire the necessities of books. The Argentine Book Chamber and the publishers who are cooperating with it have undertaken a human, patriotic and Christian mission. While others strive to leave the seat of man's intelligence, they are trying to put into the hands of the people intellectual, moral and good books."
