Sister M. Barbara Wismer, Superior at St. Peter and Paul's School, Rochester, died June 23, 1943.
Funeral services for Sister M. Barbara, nee Martha Wismer, were held at the School Sisters of Notre Dame Convent, Baltimore, on Friday, June 24. Burial was in the Sisters' plot at Villa Marie, North Cove, Md.

Sister Mary Barbara who for several years was Superior at St. Peter and Paul's School, Rochester, died June 23, 1943.
Elderly child of the late Adam and Catherine Wismer, Sister Barbara was born in Irondequoit on her father's farm which is now Durand Kaufman Park. She entered the Congregation of the School Sisters of Notre Dame at Holy Redeemer's, 32 years ago and taught most of those years in school in New York and Baltimore as well as being Superior at St. Peter and Paul's.

Surviving are one brother, Henry Wismer of Geneva, N. Y.; four sisters, Mrs. Josephine Allenby, Mrs. Mary Hartman, and Mrs. Edward Rehberg of Rochester, Mrs. Joseph Bauman of Webster.

Solemn Memorial Services
For PFC Robert L. Bossert

Solemn Memorial Services were held on Sunday, June 27, for the repose of the soul of Private Robert L. Bossert, twenty year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Olof Bossert, 67 Carthage Street, who had been killed June 4 in an accident in the North African theater.
Private Bossert was a graduate of the Aquinas Institute in 1942, and had been overseas about five months. He was attached to an ordnance unit. The War Department telegram, received by the parents, merely said that he had been killed in an accident, and advised his parents that further details would be sent to them in a letter.

The impressive rites were conducted by the Reverend Pastor, Father F. J. Hoefen, assisted by Fathers Joseph G. Merkel and Milton J. Kelly.
Private Bossert was the first member of Rochester Regiment, Knights of St. John, to lose his life in the present war.
