Democracy's Need Outlined By Prelate

BUENOS AIRES. (CNC) — Democracy will not be saved so long as leaders and those responsible do not develop peoples who have "well-nourished bodies and well-enlightened souls," the Most Rev. Miguel de Andres, Titular Bishop of Tamasca, said in an address at the ceremony which closed the Argentine Book Fair. The Fair, sponsored by the Argentine Book Chamber and open to the public for a month, was visited by 2,200,000 persons.

Discussing the various categories of aristocracy, Bishop de Andres said: "The aristocracy of neither money, power nor blood has much effect on me; but there are others which I admire and venerate: the aristocracy of labor, of virtue and of intelligence. Fortunately none of these three is the exclusive patrimony of a class and, according to the general rule, they arise from the people.

"Unfortunately the aristocracy of intelligence has not become general because of lack of cultivation. It lacks nutrition; it has not been able to acquire the sustenance of books. The Argentine Book Chamber and the publishers who are cooperating with it have undertaken a human, patriotic and Christian mission. While others strive to lower the cost of meat and bread, they are trying to put into the hands of the people useful, sane and good books."
