TIMELY ETERNALS

HEREDITY

"What can I do? Please help me!" The good old mother was desperate, and the woe in her face was deep. Her boy had married a nice girl almost a year ago, and the young wife was



After that revelation, the same hopelessness which had seized the mother, assailed me.

"Was his alcoholic father a gambler?" "Yes, but he was such a fun man in every way. Dad read his soul. It was his own weak-

She boasted that her boy was a splendid young fellow, too, but his one failing was now about to ruin his future, condemn his young family to poverty and misery, and leave his mother's steps to the grave.

In the mind of a parent who is a gambler, a drunkard or a peevish or head to follow the parent's wrong footsteps? The sensible answer is in the negative. The offspring of a mother whose lungs are affected does not necessarily contract tuberculosis. It may develop the child to the great disease, but with care and caution, he can develop and grow into strong maturity.

ONE HANDICAP

And so it is with children of morally afflicted parents. They can be made to grow up into sound men, if all precautions are taken from early childhood. There is one great handicap, however, which makes the prevention of a parental character weakness in the child more difficult, and that is, the bad example in which he is so often exposed.

The contagion of drunkenness and waywardness is not so dangerous as gambling, because these former weaknesses are more abhorred. The latter mental disease has, in a certain sense, more disastrous consequences, because lying and dishonesty invariably follow in its wake, especially when the player does not run in luck. Not that the poor victim wants to lie and steal; but, at times, he is forced to carry up, hoping for Dame Luck to smile on him the next time. And how many gamblers make money at their pastime? Not two out of ten. For most of them, there is no next time, except at long intervals. It is more difficult to cure a gambler than any other weakness.

CAREFUL WATCHING

Parents, therefore, cannot be too careful in watching for the symptoms of the gambling fever in their children, and they should make sensible prohibitory rules as soon as the inclination is discovered. It is very risky to take matters lightly when children are small. Do not allow them to be exposed or encouraged at any time, lest that they obtain and refrain, even if they have to appear unreasonable and to refuse to get into the social swim when the occasion presents itself.

As they get older, you can explain matters to them. If you would have to warn them against their own father, and so make him less acceptable in their eyes, you should take this step for the children's sake. They can still be saved, though their father may seem a hopeless case. This procedure can ever have a good effect on him. There are very few fathers so depraved that they no longer care for the appreciation of their children, whose pride they always should be.

TRAGIC REALIZATION

I know of a father who was an alcoholic all his life, until he was cured in one day. His oldest son, as a compromise, had been allowed to drink beer. One day, the father, half drunk, found his young man was hopelessly staggering about in a room after drinking whisky. He knocked him down; the son got up and, in a drunken rage, kicked his father around the place, scolding him in vile language for all the abuse and misery he had caused the boy's mother and the rest of the fam-

ily since the young man was a baby. "If you could be drunk for forty years, what right have you to object to my being drunk one day?" This tragic happening, the old man told his wife and had enough had turned a gambler—so-called the father.

Parents, what a prospect is that! What a nightmare to picture that some day, your own boy has to go in the penitentiary for defaulting on taking money which he was to employ next day after watching a film at the store table! Pray God to spare you the humiliation of having a son who is a tragic victim, a boy leader, or a reckless spender, rashly spending his young manhood, never finding satisfaction at home, looking for excitement and distraction in places and with friends who will make him lose his soul and body.

In your efforts to down a possible hereditary bad trait in your children, do not make your restrictions arbitrary. Do not create a forbidden-fruit situation that may be too tempting. Make a generous substitution that will draw them away from a particular weakness, never attempting to spite them with that of a father by second guessing, and above all point out to them the necessity of God's grace that can be obtained only through daily religious duties.
