

Bishop Encourages First Friday Devotion Of Laymen

In these times of great human suffering, devotion to the Sacred Heart, as manifested by the First Friday Luncheon Club members, should be given every encouragement.

It is expected that the Sacred Heart of Jesus is going to be deeply touched with the human suffering in the world today.

This message was given by His Excellency, the Most Rev. James M. Kearney, D.D., Bishop of Rochester, at the First Friday Luncheon Club at his session on the Feast of the Sacred Heart at Hotel Sagamore, July 2.

Under the personal guidance of the Bishop, as State Chaplain of the Knights of Columbus, the group was formed last December. Started with 26 Catholic laymen, the number present on July 2 was 28.

His Excellency pointed out that the organization was motivated by one particular phase of religion, piety. He expressed his appreciation to the priests at the faculty of St. Bernard's Seminary who have unselfishly given of their services as speakers.

Among the promises of the Sacred Heart to St. Margaret Mary, the Bishop stressed the special blessings that come from promoting the devotion. The whole idea of the movement from beginning to end has been deeply religious.

To bring home the significance of the devotion at this time of trial and to emphasize the need for keeping men's thoughts on the Sacred Heart, His Excellency quoted an article from "The Sign" magazine touching upon the little boy's plea to his mother, "Have a Heart, Mom."

His Excellency said, speaking of the Sacred Heart of Jesus: "Let us go to Him and I don't believe He will be surprised, upset or resentful. If we say 'O Divine Lord, Have a Heart.'"

The Rev. Raymond G. Heisel, moderator, presided. At the speaker's table also were the Rev. John E. Whalen, the Rev. William J. Hoffmann, the Rev. Albert J. Ryan and the Rev. Bernard V. Pennington, Frank E. Wolff, President of the Rochester Diocesan Holy Name Society was chairman.

Condemn Leaders Who Deprive Man of Reason

NEW YORK (NY) — Certain leaders of nations have "deprived man of his reason" and because of this "the world is being dragged through a whole series of catastrophes," a Vatican Radio Speaker declared in a broadcast to France reported by Government monitors here.

The Vatican speaker pleaded for "a reconquest of reason" by a return to "less vain words and more persuasion and respect for human nature, less agitation and slogans and more tranquility and practical respect for the complexities of all problems, less appeal to an animal form of morals which changes according to the pseudo-interests of the moment and more loyalty to absolute principles, less earthly passion and more Christian humanity."

On July 16, Monday earlier Masses, there will be a Solemn High Mass at 8:00 A. M., at which the novena will be presided by the Rev. Dr. Maynard Connel, Professor of English at St. Bernard's Seminary.
