

Divorce Far Outnumber Marriages in Los Angeles

LOS ANGELES — Divorces are outnumbering marriages in some months daily more than two to one in Los Angeles County; a study of the vital statistics in daily newspapers indicates.

In one Los Angeles daily last week there were recorded 67 legal separations as opposed to 23 marriages.

Additional to the legal separations there were records of 20 new divorce suits filed.

SEMINARY IN DIRE NEED

On the slopes of the Mount of Olives, scene of Our Lord's agony, there is a Preparatory Seminary for the priests of the Syrian Rite, one of the oldest tides in the Church. Formerly the Catholics of France sent small donations to help the reverend Father Chibas-Lassalle, prepare candidates for the missionary priesthood. Now all that help is gone.

The action was taken following a brief debate between the sponsor of the measure, Senator Bruce Hendrickson, of Wilcox, and Senator Vincent Kilborn of Mobile, on the necessity for the sterilization. Senator Kilborn, following the exchange, moved to postpone the bill indefinitely, and Senator Hendrickson countered by moving to table the motion. The move to table was defeated and the indefinite postponement was voted.
