The Rev. Charles J. Bruton, Pastor of St. Margaret Mary's Church, Irondequoit, announced last Sunday the purchase of a home at 2596 St. Paul Blvd. It will be remodeled to serve the needs of the increasing demands for the expansion of the parish.

**CAUSE OF MOTHER CABBINI ADVANCED ANOTHER STEP**

**VATICAN CITY** — The cause for the canonization of Blessed Francis Xavier Cabrini, Foundress and first Superior General of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus who died in Chicago, Ill., in 1917, is advanced another step by one of three decrees of the Sacred Congregation of Rites which His Holiness, Pope Pius XII, has ordered to be read and promulgated.

The decree gives approval to two miracles proposed in Blessed Mother Cabrini's cause.

The second decree authorizes procedure to beautification of the Venerable Franciscan, Bishop, Gregorio Grassi, Francesco Fogliola, Antonio Fantozzi and Theobald Verhaeghen, and their Companions—all of whom were slain in China during the Boxer Uprising in 1900.

The third decree authorizes similar action in the cause for beautification of the Venerable Alix LeClerc (Marie Therese of Jesus), Foundress of the Augustinian Canonesses Regular of the Congregation of Our Lady.

Expressing regret at leaving the old rectory which was located at 122 Scholfield Rd., Father Bruton stated that the size of the parish necessitated another assistant priest. However, as he pointed out, the present house would not permit of this addition.

The new parish home on St. Paul Blvd. at the corner of Titus Ave. was acquired without "one penny of additional cost to the parish" according to the announcement of the Pastor.

Looking into the future Father Bruton advised the congregation of the building expansion program which is to come. He said: "The building program for the parish will be first the extension of the school. Already we are using the hall for four class rooms which is far from satisfactory. After the school is adequately adjusted the question of a church large enough for the community will arise."

**Bishop In Brazil**

**Vatican City** — The appointment of the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Delfino Ribeiro Gusdes as Bishop of the new Diocese of Leopoldina in Brazil has been announced here by the Holy See.

**ST. ISIDORE NAMED PATRON OF FARMERS OF QUEBEC**

**QUEBEC** — The Sacred Congregation of Rites has informed His Eminence, Rodrigue Cardinal Villeneuve, Archbishop of Quebec, that St. Isidore has been named patron Saint of the farmers of Quebec.

The request was made by the Quebec Catholic Farmers Union at a meeting last September of the Archbishops and Bishops of Quebec. Cardinal Villeneuve submitted the request to the Holy Father.
