The Capuchin Fathers take care of the Shiloh Indians and their missions embrace the eastern part of Montana. Franciscan Sisters conduct a boarding school for the Indian children while the fathers move from station to station, caring for the spiritual needs of the Indians. The Fathers have thousands of acres of grazing land to raise Montana beef, by which they are enabled to feed and care for the Indian children during the school months.

#### Non-Catholic Cleric Opposes Mixed Marriage

TORONTO.—(NCI)—A non-Catholic clergyman, the Rev. George E. Trumbull, warned against the dangers of mixed marriages in a sermon he preached in the Fairlawn United Church, here. The clergyman said:

Lieut. Col. Alice now is stationed at Camp Rock, La. He was in

the Middle East from January until July, 1942, serving as an observer attached to the British Eighth Army. He was in Egypt when Marshall Rommel's forces began their drive toward Alexandria and saw action in the Libyan desert, where he was in an engagement against Nazi tank forces.


