Costa Rica President Lauds Archbishop's Stand On Vanguardia

SAN JOSE, Costa Rica (C.N.C.)—Archbishop of the Most Rev. Victor Sánchez, Archbishop of San José, regarding the dissolution of the Communist Party in Costa Rica and the establishment of the new Vanguardia Popular party was described as "faithful to his duties as a citizen" and meriting "the applause and gratitude of his fellow citizens," by President Rafael Calderón Guardia in a press conference here.

"The reducing of the Communist Party by Vanguardia Popular," the President said, "constitutes an event of the greatest importance. By a happy coincidence, the dissolution of the Communists has elicited a transformation which thousands of Costa Ricans desired for the welfare of Costa Rica; all Delegates of the extinct Communist Party have united in showing respect for a realistic and patriotic program."

This program, the President added, upholds postulates which are in keeping with "the principles of the Catholic Church."

"I wish publicly to recognize that in the attitude assumed by His Excellency the Archbishop and by Señor Moisés Valverde (head of Vanguardia Popular) the virtue of sincerity was luminous," President Calderón Guardia said.

The Archbishop, he added, is "above the unclean winds that fan politics kindled for personal ambition" and was "faithful to his duties as Archbishop and also as a citizen," when he approved the dissolution of the Communist Party and did not condemn "a program formulated with positive patriotic orientation."

"Inspired by his Christian sentiments and faithful to his creed, with integrity and dignity," the Chief Executive said, the Archbishop has "concretely set before Catholic consciences powerful reasons why the defunct Communist Party should not be confused with Vanguardia Popular, the orientation of which is compatible with the teachings and aspirations of the Catholic Religion."

Catholic Army Flier Wins Two Decorations

FREDERICKSBURG, Tex.—Lieut. Charles Stelling, Army flier, alumna of St. Mary's High School and former student at St. Mary's University, San Antonio, has been twice decorated for heroism somewhere in India, according to advice received here.

Lieut. Stelling, a member of St. Mary's parish and son of Felix Stelling, widely known Catholic brazier here, first was decorated with the Air Medal, the reports stated, and shortly afterward won the coveted Distinguished Service Cross.

Woman Physician Named Magistrate

BOMBAY, India.—Dr. Josephine de Lima Coutinho, a Catholic who has an extensive medical practice among both Catholics and non-Catholics in this area, has been appointed a Justice of the Peace for the City and Island of Bombay. She has practiced medicine here since 1928 and for several years served as medical officer of St. Joseph's Home, in Agripada, and of St. Anthony's Home. She took a leading part in the establishment of the Hathi Maternity Home, in Tharkhad, Bombay, of which she is chief medical officer.

Holy See Erects New Province In Bolivia

VATICAN CITY—(C.N.C.)—A division in the ecclesiastical province of Sucre, in Bolivia, was announced here this week in L'Observateur Romain, with the erection of the new province of La Paz.

The paper also announced the elevation of the Most Rev. Abel Urdiales Antezana y Reina, Bishop of La Paz, to the rank of Archibishop. The province of the new Archdiocese includes the suffragan Dioceses of Cochabamba and Oruro.
