FAMINE, DISEASE RAMPANT IN VALLEY

Nine of our missionaries are working in the Valley of the Christians in Syria. Most of the very poor people are suffering from tuberculosis or diseases of the eyes. Food is scarce, and all are on the verge of famine. The priests and sisters have had to become doctors and social workers. Without regard to whether one is Catholic or not, they give out medical supplies, food and money. Their kindness has drawn many to the Church.

Now the Father Superior writes to us: "How long shall we be able to carry on? Our small dispensaries and out-clinics have only scant medical supplies, which are very costly in these parts. The badly needed foodstuffs must be obtained before these people starve."

"We are doing what we can. We must not lose this chance to draw souls to the Church!"
