Mrs. Elizabeth Fox, Mother Of Priest, Dies

Mrs. Elizabeth Fox, 81, mother of the Rev. Robert J. Fox, assistant pastor St. Peter and Paul's Church, died Sunday, August 1, 1943 at her home, 78 Randolph St. She was an exemplary Catholic mother, long active in Catholic organization work and five years ago was designated one of the city's outstanding mothers.

Funeral services were to be held Wednesday of this week at the family home and St. Andrew's Church.

A parishioner of St. Andrew's Church for 27 years, Mrs. Fox was highly esteemed in the community. She was a member of the Rotary Society, the Ladies Catholic Benevolent Association and St. Monica's Guild.

Born in Perkienville, N. Y., she was the widow of Nicholas Fox who died 14 years ago. Besides Father Fox, she leaves four other sons, William E., Fred J., Frank A., Charles J. and Lawrence L.; two daughters, Mrs. Lorenz Stutz, Mrs. Harry Dodson, Mrs. Ralph Water, Mrs. Adeline Hickey, and Miss Dolores Fox; a brother, George Schirmer, Danville; 21 grandchildren and 11 great-grandchildren, and several nieces and nephews.

FRIBOURG, Switzerland -- According to reports by KIPA, Swiss Catholic Press Agency, the German Nazi Governor of Austria forbade the celebration of the Feast of Corpus Christi which occurred on a weekday.

Processions were allowed only on the following Sunday. Decoration of the streets with flowers and green boughs was prohibited "in order to save fodder for cattle and vital war material such as wood, etc."

Crop Corps Call Goes Out To K. of C. Members

Members of the Knights of Columbus were among those social, fraternal, business and professional groups receiving the first of 10,000 U. S. Crop Corps letters urging volunteer farm and cannal labor help, sent out this week.

The help of men and women who can devote part of their time to this work is vitally needed, the letter states.

Specified are three classes of workers needed.

They are:

First Division--Adults willing to work at least one week of their vacation on a farm or in a cannery.

Second Division--Groups of children and young people to go out weekdays on fruit picking or harvest jobs, under adult supervision.

Third Division--Adults, working in squads to work weekends or other spare time.

Members are asked to organize and supervise a group of young people or, if willing, to help in supervising a group already formed.

"Every civic organization in the city is asked to furnish four days work for each member during the season. One day's work saves enough food to feed a family for two weeks," the letter states.

"Unless 1942 crops are fully harvested and preserved there will be a real famine next winter. Shortage of manpower is handicapping the farmer and the canner, and the help of men and women who can devote part of their time to this work is vitally needed."

100 BROOKLYN PARISHES ORGANIZE BLOOD GIFTS

BROOKLYN--One hundred parishes have sent groups of blood donors to the local Red Cross center or have received the Red Cross Mobile Unit in the parish, according to a report issued by the Diocesan Council of Catholic Women through its chairman of war activities, Mrs. Joseph P. Harigan.

Approximately 10,000 Catholics have donated blood to the Red Cross through parish groups, the Diocesan Council reports. Several groups of Religious have visited the center in a body to contribute to the blood bank.
