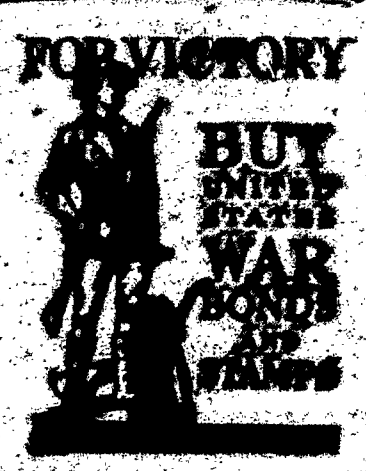

Seek Foster Homes For Children

NEW ORLEANS — Because of the heavy increase in the number of children in need of temporary foster homes, a committee has been formed of representatives of denominational, non-denominational and public child welfare agencies in the city. Members of the committee include the Most Rev. Joseph F. Ruzmet, Archbishop of New Orleans; the Rev. H. Joseph Jacob, Executive Director of the Associated Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese, and William J. Oate, a Catholic, who was elected chairman of the committee.

There are now 128 children under the care of foster mothers and fathers in New Orleans, and 200 more children for whom foster homes are needed are known to child welfare agencies. The committee has mapped out a July campaign to find 200 suitable homes for dependent and neglected children from the age of five days through adolescence.
