#### Seek Foster Homes For Children

**NEW ORLEANS.** — Because of the heavy increase in the number of children in need of temporary foster homes, a committee has been formed of representatives of denominational, non-denominational and public child welfare agencies in the city. Members of the committee include the Most Rev. Joseph R. Hummel, Archbishop of New Orleans; the Rev. H. Joseph Jacobi, Executive Director of the Associated Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese; and William J. Guste, a Catholic, who was elected chairman of the committee. There are now 125 children under the care of foster mothers and fathers in New Orleans, and 200

more children for whom foster homes are needed are known to child welfare agencies. The committee has mapped out a July campaign to find 300 suitable homes for dependent and neglected children from the age of five days through adolescence.

#### Named Vicar General

Chicago. — The Rt. Rev. Mgr. George J. Casey, Chancellor of Chicago Archdiocese, was named Vicar General June 14. The Rev. Edward M. Burke, Vice-Chancellor, has been named Chancellor, and the Rev. John D. Fitzgerald, has been named Officialis of the Tribunal Metropolitanum.

#### Corpus Christi Processions Forbidden In Austria

**FRIBOURG, Switzerland** — According to reports by KIPA, Swiss Catholic Press Agency, the German Nazi Governor of Austria forbade the celebration of the Feast of Corpus Christi which occurred on a weekday. Processions were allowed only on the following Sunday. Decoration of the streets with flowers and green boughs was prohibited "in order to save fodder for cattle and vital war material such as wood, etc."

#### Oblates Safe

Vatican City.—All Oblate Missionaries in the Philippines are safe but have been interned by the Japanese occupation forces. It is revealed in news Fides Service has finally been able to obtain on this point. The Missions staffed by the Oblates have either been destroyed, burned or confiscated. It is stated.
