### SODALITY FOR BOYS

NEW ORLEANS—Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish is twice a pioneer. It was the first to make use of a regulation of the Orleans (civil) Parish School Board providing release time for religious instruction of children and the first to have a bus for bringing public school children to instructions and returning them to within a block or two of their homes.

The Rev. John O'Connell, C.R.C., an assistant pastor of Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish, found among the "Laws and Regulations of the Orleans Parish School Board" the following: "A pupil may be excused for the purpose of receiving religious instruction or of attending to his religious duties. Satisfactory arrangements must be personally made by the parent or guardian with the principal in such cases."

The result was that letters from parents in Sacred Heart Parish obtained the release of 240 children of two public schools 40 minutes ahead of the regular dismissal time.

## 7,440,690 ATTEND CHURCH SERVICES HELD BY ARMY CHAPLAINS IN ONE MONTH

WASHINGTON (NC) — In a summary of the activities of U. S. Army chaplains for the months of April, the Office of the Chief of Chaplains, here, revealed an attendance of 7,440,690 persons at a total of 103,708 religious services. The summary noted that 700 reports from chaplains in the field were missing for the month.

Other statistics for the month included: Communion and sacramental occasions, 66,320; participants, 1,205,788; guardhouse and hospital visits, 65,952; pastoral activities, functional occasions, 642,680; pastoral contacts, persons reached, 4,386,037; civilian communities, functional occasions, 18,244; contacts, persons reached, 1,446,388; marriages, 4,429; professions of religion, including adult baptism, 2,398; Testaments and Bibles distributed, 163,140; religious tracts distributed, 293,507; religious articles distributed, 61,888; magazines and newspapers distributed, 228,184 and radio broadcasts, 50.

## Decorated For Saving Comrades' Lives

WALSENBURG, Colo. — The Purple Heart decoration has been bestowed upon Capt. William Dennison, of the Army engineer corps, an alumnus of St. Mary's High School, according to advices received here by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Dennison.

The award was made as the result of an action in the Tunisian campaign when Capt. Dennison was injured after he discovered and demolished a "booby trap" thereby saving the lives of other members in his command.
