

PEACE PRAYERS ASKED ON FEAST OF ASSUMPTION

Pontiff Exhorts Faithful To Turn To Blessed Mother; Renew Christian Way of Life

Urging Catholics not only to pray that the Blessed Mother will obtain from her Divine Son a Christian peace but that they should also renew in themselves a life "in keeping with Christian teaching and principles," Pope Pius XII has called on the faithful throughout the world to join in a crusade of prayer for a Christian peace on Sunday, August 10, the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin.

The Holy Father made his appeal in a letter to His Eminence, Luigi Cardinal Maglione, Pope Secretary of State, to whom he entrusted the task of communicating the Sovereign Pontiff's desire to all the Catholic world, particularly to the Bishops. His Holiness said he knows the Catholic world "is ready to second Our desires."

Pope Pius said "men seem to pay no heed to Our anxious and supplicating voice," and that he raises his prayers and eyes in mourning to the Father of All Mercies. "That, as you know," he stated, "We have done repeatedly since the outbreak of this terrible war."

PRAYERS FOR PEACE

(Selected from the Roman Missal)

O Lord Jesus Christ, who didst say to thy Apostles, Peace I leave you, my peace I give you: look not upon my sins, but upon the faith of thy Church; and vouchsafe to her that peace and unity which are agreeable to thy will. Who livest and reignest with God, world without end.

Amen.

O God, from whom are holy desires, right counsels, and just works, give to thy servants that peace which the world cannot give; that our hearts may be disposed to obey thy commandments, and the fair of enemies being removed, our hearts, by thy protection, may be peaceful. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, who livest and reignest with Thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, world without end.

Amen.

O God, who permittest not the nations who believe in thee to be overwhelmed by any peril, vouchsafe to receive the prayers and offerings of thy people, that in thy mercy thou wouldst grant peace to Christendom and make it secure against all its enemies. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, who livest and reignest with Thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, world without end.

Amen.

Text of Holy Father's Plea

Text of the Holy Father's letter on the Prayer Crusade for Peace follows:

"To Our Beloved Son, Luigi Cardinal Maglione, Secretary of State.

"Beloved Son, Health and Apostolic Benediction.

"While the fraternal harmony among States is, unhappily, broken and the might of arms prevails and dominates almost everywhere, brutally crushing and torturing not only armies but peaceable populations as well. We, as the Father, feel in Our spirit the sorrows and anxieties of all, leave nothing untried in an effort to replace hate by charity and to substitute for discord and combat mutual agreement and the quiet gifts of peace.

"Since, however, men seem to pay no heed to Our anxious and supplicating voice, We raise Our prayers and Our eyes in mourning to the Father of Mercies and God of All Consolation, and We beg of Him that all may retrace their steps in penance and prayers. That, as you know, we have done repeatedly since the outbreak of this terrible war.

"In willing acquiescence, however, to the petitions addressed to Us by many of Our sons, We deem it opportune to renew now Our fatherly appeal while the heavens, so far from becoming serene, are darkening with heavier clouds.

"We wish accordingly, through you, Our Beloved Son, to appeal again to all and especially to the Bishops who, the world over, rule the flocks entrusted to their care, so that as the dangerous coils which threaten the Christian family appear graver, more fervent public prayers will be offered to God and to the Mother of God. We desire that this be done in a most particular way on the approaching Feast of the Assumption into Heaven of the Blessed Virgin, so that the great Mother of God, stirred to compassion by such afflictions of her children, by such miseries and hardships, may obtain the pardon of sins from her most benign Son and, through prompting heavenly

grace, bring calm to souls, blot out hatred and rivalries, foster harmony and, in due, make to shine forth that Christian peace through which alone victory and vanquished may be brought together again not by force but by justice and equity, and will be able to enjoy prolonged tranquility and prosperity.

"Let all united in this holy crusade raise up fervent prayers, to which let there correspond in each one a renovation of life in keeping with Christian teaching and principles. Let all aim to take the lead over others by their example, and thus may it happily come about that the pacific arms of charity, prayer and fraternity may replace the murderous arms of war.

"May we be allowed to appeal in a most particular way to the most dear people of Italy that, in this gravest crisis, they may rival the faith and Christian virtues of their ancestors and thus, as in times past, so now also, obtain from God that which both We and they desire, calling on the intercession of that innumerable cohort of Saints which their native land has given to Heaven in every age.

"To you, then, Our Beloved Son, We commit the task of communicating Our fatherly appeal in the way you judge most opportune to all — and especially to the Bishops of the Catholic World, which We know is ready to second Our desires.

"Meanwhile, in passage of Heavenly graces and as a token of Our particular benevolence, We bestow from all Our heart on you, Our Beloved Son, and on each and every one of Our children in Christ, the Apostolic Benediction.

"Pius PP. XII."

Italian Prelates Caution Against Unreasoned Action

VATICAN CITY (NC-Radio)—A reminder of the critical nature of the times, an appeal for national unity, and an urging not to prevent a proper settlement of matters by unreasoned action run through the statements members of the Italian Episcopate have addressed to their priests and people in these days that have seen the elimination of the Fascist regime in their country.

On Monday, August 2, the Most Rev. Evasio Celli, Bishop of Parma and Director General of Italian Catholic Action, issued the following statements:

"In this grave hour of responsibility, Italian Catholic Action—whose chief end is the defense and increase of Christian life and civilization—gives to its associates a single directive: Continue your work with exemplary obedience to the Church and loyal discipline in regard to constituted authorities.

"Italian Catholic Action has nothing to forewear of its past labors, but rather rejoices justly in the results of its efforts at the formation of a Christian conscience during these years and feels the duty and the necessity of continuing and intensifying this work now and for the future. The extreme delicacy of the present situation imposes on all the associates of Catholic Action the closest union with their Church and with their fellow members, and the liveliest sense of their duty for the sake, and the triumph of Jesus Christ, the welfare of the Church

SAN LORENZO BASILICA RECONSTRUCTION BEGUN

and the true Christian prosperity of the homeland."

Cardinal Dall'Osta, Archbishop of Florence, recommended to his people, in a pastoral, those solid principles without which he said the rebirth of Italy and the world is impossible—principles which he added are better understood today, since their abandonment has led humanity to the present catastrophe, to deplore which there are not now and never will be adequate words.

Fraternal love, Cardinal Dalla Costa said, remains unchanged and is unchangeable. It excludes absolutely, he declared, recrimination and vengeance and is absolutely opposed to those racial theories that are arbitrarily and fatally dividing humanity.

Family bonds, which for some time have been relaxed, must be reinforced, the Archbishop of Florence continued. The principle that families and individuals do not exist for the state, but that the state exists for families and individuals remains indisputable, he added. As has been solemnly stated on many occasions by His Holiness Pope Pius XII, the Cardinal continued, the dignity of the human person is sacred and he has inalienable rights to free initiative in economic, moral and political spheres that are necessary to the proper development and perfection of the individual.

Saying an ordered and gradual revision of the existing economic and social structure is necessary, Cardinal Dalla Costa declared that the principles of social justice must be observed and that, therefore, the condition of labor must be elevated, and it should participate in the benefits of enterprises, according to the Papal teachings. There must be provision not only for the present but also for the future needs of the individual and the family, he said.

There must also be a return to respect for Christian morality in the life of individuals, of families and of nations, Cardinal Dalla Costa asserted. This return, he said, must be accompanied by the absolute conviction that what harms others is never truly beneficial to us; that violence generates violence and is our own ruin; that the violation of the moral law in political life is to advantage but is actually harmful to collectivity.

These principles, which will restore to the world the peace it has lost, have always been proclaimed by the Church, Cardinal Dalla Costa said. He added that now those who supported opposing principles are turning once more to the Church for light.

China's First Lady Lauds Missioners and Supporters

NEW YORK—Lauding the "selfless devotion" of Catholic missionaries in China, Madame Chiang Kai-shek declares in a letter to Bishop Paul Yu Pin, Vicar Apostolic of Nanking,

that the generosity of American Catholics who uphold the hands of these missionaries is "deeply appreciated."

The letter, signed Mayling Soong Chiang, was dispatched to Bishop Yu Pin just before Madame Chiang left the United States in June to return to her homeland. It has just been made public here, following its presentation by Bishop Yu Pin to the National office of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith.

Madame Chiang's letter to Bishop Yu Pin follows:

"The sympathy and practical assistance given so generously by the American Catholics in your line missionaries who are suffering my people in war-torn

China are deeply appreciated. All of us who have come in contact with your missionaries are impressed with their selfless devotion to the alleviation of human suffering and the elevation of man's spiritual potentialities."

Acknowledging the gift of the letter, the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Thomas J. McDonnell, National Director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, said "the contents will bring to the friends and benefactors of the Catholic Missions in China a consolation in knowing that their prayers and sacrifices in behalf of the China missionaries are recognized and appreciated by Generalissimo and Madame Chiang Kai-shek."
