

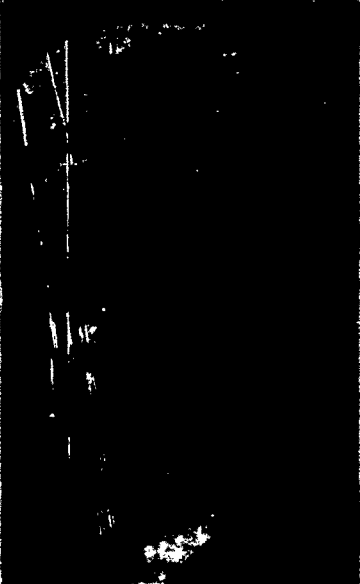
Fr. McMillen, Speaker For K. of C. Field Day

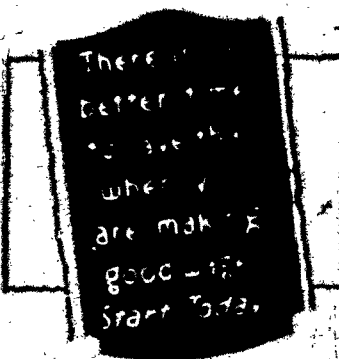

Civilian Education Championed By Head Of St. Bonaventure's

ST. BONAVENTURE—In his address at the Summer School Commencement, the Very Rev. Thomas Mangano, O.F.M., Ph.D., L.H.D., R.T.D., President of St. Bonaventure College, emphasized the especial time-worthiness of civilian education.

"The cultural Arts and Sciences must not be neglected in an era when culture is being destroyed on a global scale. The very things for which the Allied nations are striving with all their might are embodied in the culture and the uplifting of the masses. The depletion of school faculties by draft, enlistment and the volunteering of professors and teachers for special military instruction necessitates the training of a new corps of educated men and women to carry on the work which these former have had to abandon.

"The post-war world," the President continued, "will be gravely in need of instruction both in the arts and sciences. Students of European and Pan-American languages will be called upon to fill a definite and pertinent role.

"Our College does not intend to default in its service to civilians who look to her for guidance and instruction of the democratic and cultural type. We are equipped to accommodate the need of the 300 Army Trainees whom the Army have entrusted to our program. But we are also able to throw our doors open to civilians even though the additional strain is put on our faculty and facilities."

In order to meet newer trends St. Bonaventure College will open in the first week of September and regular courses leading to all peacetime and wartime requirements will be offered. The President promised that St. Bonaventure College would continue to cooperate to the fullest with the Army schedule and that normal scholastic programs would be offered to every applicant.

Trains Army Engineers

Los Angeles—Loyola University of Los Angeles has been designated an army training school in basic engineering by the 5th Army Service Command and 215 specialized candidates arrived on the campus today to take up their courses under the direction of Dean Daniel Whalen of the Department of Engineering.
