Urge Marital As
Eternal Salvation Aid

ST. ANNE DE BEAUPRE, Quebec — Transformation of war-time difficulties into supernatural aids for eternal salvation was urged by the Most Rev. Francis J. J. Beckman, Archbishop of Dubuque, in a address to pilgrims gathered at the Shrine of St. Anne de Beaupre.

The Archbishop declared that the war had brought a "wonderful opportunity" through its hardships for all men to score up spiritual blessings. "Too many of our spiritual children in America are failing to sacrifice for Christ, to suffer for Christ and to offer for Christ," he said.

A warning was issued by the Archbishop against the "diabolical forces at work" which with just for power and with mirthful hatred have "spawned Communism, Nazism, materialism and all those other vicious philosophies which afflict and divide the society of men."
