Urges Hardship As Eternal Salvation Aid

ST. ANNE DE BEAUFRE, Quebec — Transformation of wartime hardships into supernatural aids for eternal salvation was urged by the Most Rev. Francis J. L. Beckman, Archbishop of Dubuque, in a address to pilgrims gathered at the Shrine of St. Anne de Beaupre.

The Archbishop declared that the war had brought a "wonderful opportunity" through its hardships for all men to share up spiritual blessings. "The many of our spiritual children in America are joining the lesson of this war, which is to sacrifice for Christ, to suffer for Christ and to offer for Christ," he said.

A warning was issued by the Archbishop against the "diabolical forces at work" which with just for power and with purblind hatred have spawned Communism, Nazism, materialism and all those other vicious philosophies which smother and divide the society of men.
